<u>Purpose</u>: To celebrate Asian & Pacific Islander American heritage and to promote greater access to the arts in Los Angeles

**Theme: "Honoring Our Pioneers and Uniting Future Generations"** 

To participate in this Poster competition, it is required that you choose one of the following figures from Asian & Pacific Islander American history and connect it to the theme:

Charlie Apana (a Hawaii detective); Katherine Cheung (Chinese American aviator/barnstorming pilot); Connie Chung (first Chinese American to co-anchor a major network's national news broadcast); Le Ly Hayslip (Vietnamese American writer); Dosan Ahn Chang Ho (Korean American civil rights activist and leader); Larry Itliong (Filipino American union organizer); Mubarak Ali Khan (Asian Indian and head of The India Welfare League); Yuri Kochiyama (Japanese American civil rights activist); K.W. Lee (Pioneering Korean American journalist); Sammy Lee (Korean American who won two gold medals in the U.S. Olympics diving team); Queen Liliuokalani (the last reigning monarch of the Hawaiian Islands); Dr. Haing S. Ngor (First Cambodian American to win an Academy Award); Betty Ong (Chinese American flight attendant who was on the plane that crashed into the World Trade Center); Ellison Onizuka (Japanese American astronaut killed in the Challenger explosion).

Eligibility: Any child and teen living in Los Angeles County (in grades K-12 in public, private, or charter school)

## Poster entry must have the following information:

on a 3 x 5 index card **tapped** to the back:

- 1. Title of work & medium
- 2. Student full name & visible grade level
- 3. Student home mailing address
- 4. Student home phone number or cell number
- 5. School name & address
- 6. Teacher's full name, telephone number, e-mail
- 7. A sentence about the inspiration/description of the depicted subject matter

## **Poster Guidelines:**

- Poster size MUST NOT EXCEED 11" x 17" (without a mat board)
- Poster must be on paper, canvas or wood Only two-dimensional posters will be accepted 3D work will NOT be accepted
- Collage is accepted ONLY IF IT IS ORIGINAL ARTWORK (magazine cutouts or previously published material not accepted)
- Poster medium can be watercolor, acrylic, oil, pen, pencil, chalk, marker, or original digital images or photography
- Poster must be signed by the student at the bottom right corner on the side of the work
- Poster will be judged on quality of the work, originality and creativity of the depicted figure chosen within the theme
- Only one entry per person (Previous Heritage Poster Competition 1<sup>st</sup> place winners in calendar years 2007 2008 are ineligible for 1<sup>st</sup> Place)

<u>Deadline</u>: <u>Posters MUST arrive by 5:00 pm on Friday, April 25, 2008</u> (this is <u>NOT</u> a postmark date)

Prizes: SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS\* provided by Wells Fargo Bank to 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> Place winners in each division.
