I. REGISTRATION

1. Purpose

To promote sports participation and the cooperative spirit of the Chinese community in the United States.

4. Eligibility

- 1) All teams can have two (2) Non-Asian players maximum.
- 2) Players with good health conditions and/or have physician's release to participate.
- 3) Each participant shall assume full responsibility for all of his/her injuries occurred in the tournament.
- 4) Co-Educate players/Girl players are welcomed.
- 5) Any Community High School Team has more than two(2) Non-Asian players, play exhibit only.
- B. Top 3 teams advance to International Youth Basketball Championship in each Division.

c) The CAAA Youth Basketball League Commissioners reserve the right to change to other Gyms.

11. Official Website

- a) All schedules will be posted 1 week before the actual game time
- b) Team scores and rankings will be posted 1 week after the game time

12. Method of Scheduling

- a) Time preference shall be declared on entry form. All scheduled games are final. A \$50 fee will be assessed for any changes made after the posting of the schedule on our website.
- b) Number of games and method of elimination are based on the number of teams in each division. Methods include double round robin, sub-division round robin, and others.

13. Method of Placement

- a) Upon identical records, the outcome of the game played between the 2 determines placement.
- b) Upon identical records of 3 or more teams, the net spread from games among the teams in question determines placement.
- c) Group playoff records are counted toward division playoff records.

14. Awards

Team trophies and individual medals will be given to the top 3 teams in each division.

15. Amendments

- a) Teams are required to register players' names and numbers to the scorekeeper 15 minutes prior to game time. A technical foul will be given for noncompliance.
- b) Among similar divisions with alphabetical classification, the champion of each division is promoted to the next high classification.
- c) Players registered under divisions with age limitations can participate with 3 teams among different divisions.
- d) Players registered under divisions with age limitations must carry proper identification for verification at the first game. Players are prohibited from participating without proper identification.
- e) Age's division players must provide proper age identification with entry form.
- f) Divisions with less than 4 teams participating will be combined with other divisions by tournament organizers.
- g) Players list after First Game will be FINAL ROSTER.

16. Special Regulations

To follow the purpose of the tournament and to uphold sportsmanship, the tournament shall permanently ban participants who initiate bodily harm to any individual involved with the tournament.

17. Protest Procedures

a) If game rules specifically apply to a disagreement, the referee's decision is final. If

game rules possess similar interpretation, the protest is prohibited. If a disagreement is not game rule related or cannot be interpreted, organizing officials will review the written protest, and their decision is final.

- b) Team representatives shall present proper protest in writing with a \$40 fee; if the protest is considered improper, the \$40 fee will be donated toward award funding.
- c) Protest regarding player eligibility is to be formally declared to the organizing official prior to competition.
- d) In addition to oral protest of competition related disagreements, protest requirements are to be completed within 30 minutes after declaration of game outcome, the protest is void otherwise.
- e) Players and staff members are prohibited from questioning referees during competition.

II. EQUIPMENT

A. Uniforms will be either T-shirts or basketball shirts. Shirts must have a number to identify the players. Numbers must be on back and front with a minimum 4 or 6 or 8" on front and 6 or 8" on back. Uniforms must be uniform within team.

B. Basketballs

- 1. Synthetic leather or leather basketballs may be used on the approval of both coaches. If there is no agreement, the rubber basketball will be used.
- 2. 10 & Under will use the 28.5" rubber/synthetic basketball.
- 3. 11-12 and older will use a regulation(standard) basketball.

III. PLAYING RULES

******* C.A.A.A. BASKETBALL LEAGUE RULES 1/2008 *******

National High School Basketball Federation Rules are used with the following modifications:

- A team may start and play the whole game with FOUR players.
- A team is allowed a 5-minutes grace period.
- A game consists of 5 quarters of 8-minutes (was two halves of 20-minutes) running-time each. There will be 1 minute between quarters. The last "15 seconds" of the 4th quarter is stop-time Each player will play 2 guarters min. and 4 guarters max.
- The last "2 minutes" of the 5th guarter is always stop-time, if THE SPREAD OF THE SCORE IS 15 OR MORE, THEN THE RUNNING CLOCK. A game will have TWO over-time periods of 2-minutes stop-time each if needed.
- The THIRD over-time period is "sudden-death" the team that scores the first point(s) wins.
- Each team is allowed 4 time-outs per game including the over-time periods. This means no extra timeout in any of the over-time periods.

 • 1-and-1 free-throws start at the 7th team fouls in each half.
- 2 free-throws start at the 10TH team-fouls in each half.

*** SOME RECENT CHANGES FOR HIGH SCHOOL BASKETBALL RULES ***

• A "technical foul" is also counted toward a "personal foul" and toward a "team foul".

- All "intentional fouls" carry a penalty of 2 free-throws, and the ball is awarded to the offended team at nearest the foul.
- A player commits a violation if he while being "closely guarded "anywhere" in his front court holds the ball for five seconds or dribbles the ball for five seconds.
- The ball must leave inbounder's hands in less than 5 seconds.
- No free throws for double technical fouls or simultaneous technical fouls by opposite opponents.

**** NEW RULS BEGINNING 1997-1998 SEASON *****

On free-throws, ALL players must not penetrate the free throw lane area until the ball touches the rim.

IV. CONDUCT AND PLAYING TIME RULES

- A. Suspensions
 - 1. Player Suspensions
 - a. Fighting.
 - b. Undue abuse against a CAAA official by player or his/her parents.
 - c. Unauthorized team jumping.
 - 2. Coach Suspensions
 - a. Unbecoming conduct contrary to the aims and purpose of the CAAA program as outlined by the CAAA Board.
 - b. Unauthorized player raids.
 - 3. Player/Coach Ejections
 - a. If a coach or a player is ejected from a game/gym due to conduct or via two (2) technical fouls, a minimum of a one (1) game suspension will be assessed.
